KEY QUALIFICATIONS

Qualified as a Medical Doctor in 1989 from Makerere University Medical School Uganda and obtained MSc degree in Epidemiology and Biostatistics from Case Western Reserve University, USA in 1997. Trained in 1993 by Mildmay International/British Council in the care, management and counseling of people living with HIV/AIDS. Trained in 1994 by WHO in STD/AIDS Epidemiology and attended a course in 1999 in the Principles of STD and HIV Research from the Centre for AIDS and STD, University of Washington, Seattle, USA. Trained in 2004 in Strategic Leadership on Population and health at The Bill and Melinda Gates Institute for population and reproductive health, John Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health, Baltimore, USA.

Was a Program Director/Principal Investigator for a PMTCT Program (2002-2005) and the first ever Full-Access District-wide Door-Door/home-based VCT (HBVCT) supported by CDC and implemented in Bushenyi district (Oct 2004 – June 2007). Now the Program Director for the CDC supported Community PMTCT Program aiming at seeing the dawn of an HIV free generation in the Ankole Region.

Has been a Member of Parliament of Uganda since 2001 and for six and half years (2002-2009) served as the Chairperson of the Committee on HIV/AIDS and Related Matters, the first of its kind in Africa. Also was one of the founders and Chairperson of the HIV/AIDS Advisory Group of the Inter-Parliamentary Union (IPU) {2006-2009} a World body bringing together over 150 countries. He is still a Member of the HIV/AIDS Committee, Parliament of Uganda and the IPU HIV/AIDS Advisory Group. Has also been the Treasurer of the Forum for the Afro-Arab Parliamentarians on Population and Development (FAAPPD) since 2006. Has since 1990 worked as a researcher, trainer, health educator, clinician, program director, political leader as well as book author/editor.

CURRENT RESPONSIBILITIES

July 1994- to-date: Executive Director, Integrated Community Based Initiatives (ICOBI) - a Non Governmental Organization operating in Uganda which pioneered the Full-Access District-Wide Door-Door HIV Counseling and Testing program in the district of Bushenyi and is now implementing it in 6 other districts of Central Uganda. Under his leadership ICOBI has implemented various programs ranging from Nutrition and Early Childhood Programs to income generation to HIV/AIDS interventions and Research.

June 2001 to date: Member of Uganda's Parliament where he has served on the Committees of: HIV/AIDS and Related Matters; Information, Communication and Technology (ICT); and Social Services (served as Vice-Chair 2001-2003 overseeing sectors of health and education in the Republic of Uganda). From Nov 2001-to-date: Uganda's Delegate: Forum for the Afro-Arab Parliamentarians on Population and Development (FAAPPD) where he is now the Treasurer.
